## Football Futsal Tournament

Curledge Street Academy was invited to attend a Football Futsal Tournament at Paignton Community & Sports Academy on Tuesday 20th November. The event was organised by Torquay United Community Sports Trust through the Premier League. Curledge Street was reigning champions at the event and needed to defend their title against more than 12 other schools from across Torbay, Exeter and Plymouth. Under the guidance of Mr Osman, we went with a strong team of boys from years 5 and 6. After coming through the group stage of the competition the school made it to the final, and after a hard fought game the final score was 2-2: a penalty shootout was now the only way to regain the trophy! The boys held their nerve to win the shootout and remain champions.



## High 5 Netball Tournament

Curledge Street Academy was invited to take part in a High 5 Netball Tournament at Paignton Community & Sports Academy on Monday 26th November. We chose a team of 7 boys and girls from years 4 to 6. We played against 9 other primary schools from the Torbay area throughout the afternoon, playing 7 games in total. Winning 5 of those games and losing only 2, placed us 3rd in the table. The next round of games is in early March 2019, and we will be looking to finish as winners of the league having played against the strongest schools already.



## Sporting Festivals

Curledge Street is part of a cluster group of primary school from the surrounding areas who regularly take part in sports festivals which are organised by Paignton Community & Sports Academy. We have taken part in a number of festivals over the last term, ranging from Hockey and Sports Hall Athletics for years 1 to 6 and Tag Rugby for years 1 to 4.

6TR just missed out by coming 3rd in the Sports Hall Athletics.


All the children are encouraged to participate in the event which has over 250 children taking part each Thursday. Many thanks to Mr Titchard and Mr Osman who support our children at these events.

## Change 4 Life Programme

At Curledge Street we have introduced a Change 4 Life programme this term. The programme is aimed at encouraging the children to think about the benefits of a balanced diet and regular exercise. Over the academic year the school will have had over 30% of the pupils going through the programme, and hope to see children make positive lifestyle choices as a result. Some of the key objectives of the programme are to become more familiar with the different food groups, and to understand the positive effects of exercise on the body and mental health and wellbeing.



The children taking part in the programme have the opportunity to monitor their daily intake of foods and to complete an exercise chart over the 6 weeks. The underlying message of the programme is that small changes can make a big difference to their lifestyle not only now but in the future.

## Paignton Schools Football League

Mr Fegan and the SLT team have been working hard behind the scenes to make sure that the boys and girls from the school get to play competitive football this academic year.

Curledge Street has been instrumental in setting up a brand new Paignton Schools' Football League after our previous league closed.
