Dear All,

We are all settled into the new term here and, as ever, the children have already been really busy. Our Year 6 Leaders are getting to know their new jobs for the term, the Class Councils have met to put forward ideas to improve our school and raise funds and we've already been celebrating a good range of achievements in our celebrations assemblies.

We have some great opportunities lined up for the children this term. Year 2 are working with a range of partners - South Devon College and the James Dyson Foundation as well as a local engineering business, to design new and useful inventions. Their designs will be entered into the 'Young Leaders Engineering Awards' for a chance to have their design made into reality.

Year 1 are developing their links with the elderly within our community and will be writing letters to residents at Primley House. Much research has been done on the mutual benefits of building cross generational relationships so it will be interesting, if not heart-warming, to see this in practice.

Year 5 are well on the way to coming up with some new ways to use their persuasive skills and raise funds for their residential trip due to take place next September. Hold the date for an **Easter Market on Thursday April 4th** and an Easter Hat Competition too!

We are also looking forward to seeing our Dance Troupe perform at the Dance Festival and our choir perform at the Riviera Centre as part of the Torbay Schools' Festival of Performing Arts.

We were the most represented school at the event last year so we hope to see more children and families taking part and having fun this year to beat our record!

Your help and support is required...

The issue of parking around the school and the issue of transporting children to and from school has been a growing concern for me and for other members of our school community over the past few months.

Double yellow lines, no parking zones and the yellow zig-zags are all designed to keep our children safe. Parking or stopping in these areas **is illegal and dangerous**. It seriously restricts the view of children and adults trying to cross the road. It also means that drivers on the road cannot see pedestrians waiting to cross.

We have had at least 3 near misses that I know of in the last weeks of last term and the beginning of this one, including an incident where a driver mounted the pavement almost knocking a mother and child over! They were both quite shaken. I do not want any of our children to end up in hospital seriously injured or worse due to a lack of thought and care by parents of our school.

I have also been extremely disappointed and embarrassed by the response from some of our parents towards our parking attendants and police officers who have been at the school trying to address the problem and prevent our children being hurt. Neighbours of the school have also been verbally abused. This is wholly unacceptable and I ask that all members of our school community are respectful to all others in the wider community in line with our school values.

I would like to remind everyone that we do have parking permits available for the car park next to the library which allow a good amount of time for dropping off and picking up. Please ask at reception if you would like one.

I hope to see some improvement in the parking situation over the coming week.
