Sports round-up

Level 2 Bikeability

Level 2 teaches children how to grow more confident with each turn of the pedal. The expert instructors led the riders onto quiet roads, to experience "real" cycling.

The children have learnt how to start and stop with more confidence, pass parked vehicles on the road as well as understanding the road, ie signals, signs and road markings. They negotiated the road including quiet junctions, crossroads and roundabouts and shared the road with other vehicles.

The school offers a pathway for cycling throughout the years starting with Balanceability for years 1 and 2. Level 1 for years 3 and 4, and finally Level 2 for years 5 and 6.





Sports Leader training



Mr Julyan from Paignton Academy worked with the school's sports leaders and playground leaders on various activities that would engage the children at play times. Mr Julyan went through the roles and responsibilities of each position, and highlighted the importance of physical activity during the day.



Easter Learn to Ride sessions for 2-6 year olds

If your child is in year 2-6 and can't yet ride a bike without stabilisers, please consider signing them up to a 2-hour Learn to Ride Session in the Easter School Holidays at Torbay Velopark. Sessions available from 8-11 April.

The sessions cost £10 plus booking fee, and a bike and helmet can be provided. There will be a maximum of three children to each instructor. They need to be able to ride without stabilisers to be able to participate in Bikeability sessions at school, which start in year 3 in some schools.
